Mission Centre President Report:

The life of our Canada East Mission Centre has continued to be vibrant through the months of our collectively experienced pandemic uncertainty. Limited In-person connections have been transformed in many ways; some through new on-line forms but also through a resurgence of meaningful phone conversations and surprise mailings. In our yearning for connection we create. Thank you for your brilliance combined with action to reach and bless one another. Are we not now more aware of the breadth of our Canadian and global faith community? We have shared in over 100 Zoom camping events, joined with the UK in peace forums, toured historic sites.
