Monday Summary

Statement on Nonviolence Adopted

After six years of prayer, conversation, and discernment, delegates voted overwhelmingly to adopt the Statement on Nonviolence. Guided by Kelly Phipps and Sandee Gamet through the common consent process, the World Church embraced nonviolence as a faithful response to the gospel of Jesus Christ. See the statement in the *Program & Legislation* book on page 64.

Resolution Ruled Out of Order

Monday's first legislative item, Resolution G-3, regarding stewardship of the Temple and Auditorium, was declared out of order due to conflicts with church bylaws and legal standards.

President Stassi Cramm acknowledged the call for transparency, while emphasizing that church leaders must operate within governing documents. Presiding Bishop Ron Harmon noted that the Temple and Auditorium cost \$2.5 million annually to operate and shared that outside rentals are being explored to help cover costs. Repair work has already begun, following a facility assessment.

By the Numbers

As of Monday morning, 2,080 individuals had registered for World Conference (excluding staff). Sunday's Communion service drew the highest online attendance so far with 3,163 viewers, followed by President Cramm's ordination service at 2,934 viewers. And a fun note: June 3 marked President Cramm's birthday!

Honoring Departing Leaders

Several church leaders offered heartfelt thanks and gratitude as they concluded their service:

- **Jane Gardner** shared her enduring love for the sacraments and gratitude for a God who always keeps promises.
- **David Nii**, reflecting on 29 years of ministry, spoke of the church's continued potential and issued a call to courage and growth.
- **Robin Linkhart** expressed deep emotion, thanking the church for being her "steady ground" through a life of constant movement.
- **David Anderson** honored the "cloud of witnesses" who guided his journey and called the church to act justly and walk humbly, quoting from Micah.
- **Shandra Newcom** offered a moving song about hope rising from pain and transformation through sacred vision.

Budget and Governance Proposal

Delegates approved Resolution D-2a, which proposes updates to the church's budgeting and audit process. It makes financial information publicly available on *CofChrist.org*. It also reduced the size of the World Church Finance Board from 55 to 43 members.

Two board nominations were received from the floor for B-1 World Church Finance Board. Fifteen members will be elected later this week.

Ordination Celebration

Monday evening concluded with a joyful, music-filled ordination service in the Temple Sanctuary.

- **Bunda Chibwe** and **Janné Grover** were ordained as counselors to the president.
- **Mareva Arnaud Tchong** was ordained as presiding evangelist.

Voices from around the world joined in celebration through music and prayer. The service closed with a vibrant procession to the World Plaza, filled with Spirit, song, and shared hope.

In my travels throughout the church and in the sacred encounters I've shared with you in all kinds of places, I have witnessed the living presence of God—alive in our stories, our struggles, our hopes, and our acts of compassion. I testify with conviction that the God of love, healing, and reconciliation is moving among us still. The Spirit is not idle; it stirs in unexpected places, reminding us that holiness is often found in the ordinary and the broken.

While my role may be changing, my commitment to this community, to your callings, and to the vision of God's shalom remains steadfast. Today I come to the end of this chapter in ministry. It’s hard to express what it has meant to serve among you—across congregations, mission centers, and nations. You welcomed me into your lives—not just your churches and campgrounds—but into your *stories*, your *questions*, your *faith*, your *grief*, and *uncertainty*.

You invited me into holy spaces and literally poured blessings into the core of my being. The truth is this church has shaped me since the day I was born. My family moved—a lot; 19 times before I turned 20. The one constant? *You*.

Wherever we landed, the people of Community of Christ were there. You held me, taught me, welcomed me, and believed in me. You gave me a place to belong even when everything else was changing. In a life full of motion, you were my steady ground. I will always be grateful.

To my family—thank you. Thank you for sharing me with the world. For holding things together at home while I was traveling. For loving me through weeks and months away. You gave me the freedom to follow this call, even when it asked more of us than we thought we could give. I could not have done this without your patience, your strength, and your love. *You* are my home. *Always*.

Over these years, I’ve come to understand one of the most challenging and life-giving truths of the gospel: *Learning to live in community is hard*. It’s inconvenient. It’s uncomfortable. Sometimes it’s painful. It asks us to keep showing up when we’d rather walk away. It stretches us in ways we didn’t expect and maybe didn’t ask for. But it *is the place where the sacred becomes real*.

In the authentic messiness of life, community is where grace happens. Where forgiveness is practiced.

Where love takes on flesh. Even when it doesn't feel like it—even when it hurts—*it is worth it*. Every hard conversation, every small act of reconciliation, every choice to stay when it would be easier to leave, it is worth it. Because this *thing* we do together—this *sacred* community—is how we *learn to follow Jesus*.

As I turn the last page of this chapter, I do so with a full heart. You have blessed me. You have changed me. And I carry you with me—your faces, your stories, your witness to Christ's peace in the world. I'm not going far. And I'll always be cheering for you—for us—as *we keep becoming* the community God dreams we can be.

Auditorium Update Work

The picture depicts the Auditorium as it looked in 1948. In 1973 precast stone panels were added to the Auditorium to give it a more modern look. Work is currently underway to secure panels that are loose, recalk, clean, and reseal the exterior of the Auditorium. Above the east entrance you will see the original brick where work is currently underway to secure several panels. This work is part of several projects occurring on the Temple and Auditorium to ensure these structures serve the missional purposes of the church for years to come.

This peace event, hosted at the Temple, 16–18 October 2026, will honor the history of peace work of the International Peace Colloquy, which began in 1993 to encourage conversation around different issues related to peace and justice as well as offering the International Peace Award and Human Rights Award.

Over the decades, the Peace Award became a powerful symbol of Community of Christ's global commitment to peace and has lifted the voices of peacemakers from all walks of life—activists, faith leaders, environmental advocates, educators, and healers—each sowing seeds of peace in their unique contexts.

This event will continue to raise the importance of climate justice and provide opportunities for participants to explore issues related to the environmental crisis as it connects with faith and action.

The Peace Forum will feature:

- Conversation and education on critical justice issues
- Spirituality and worship grounded in faith
- Creative expression and community building
- A call to action for real-world transformation

As the event is an international gathering, we hope that there will be similar experiences hosted throughout the communities where Community of Christ is planted.
